- A. **CCBS exists** – IG #5 and IG #6 speak directly to the institution, and their focus is on providing the facilities and environment in which learning and spiritual growth can happen.

- C. **Biblical** – IG #1 speaks to the basic tenet that we are a Bible college, and our main focus is teaching biblical and theological studies. While other majors may exist, our mission is firmly rooted in biblical higher education.
- D. **Higher education** – IG #3 speaks to the fundamental general studies that all colleges must fulfill. We desire that our students graduate with the resolve of being independent researchers, critical thinkers, effective communicators, and lifelong learners.
